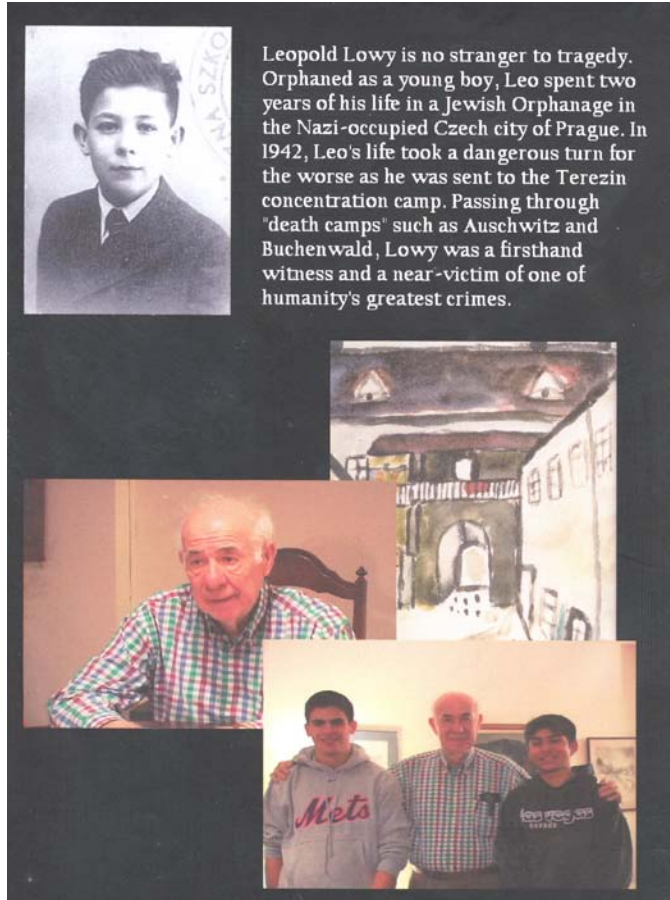
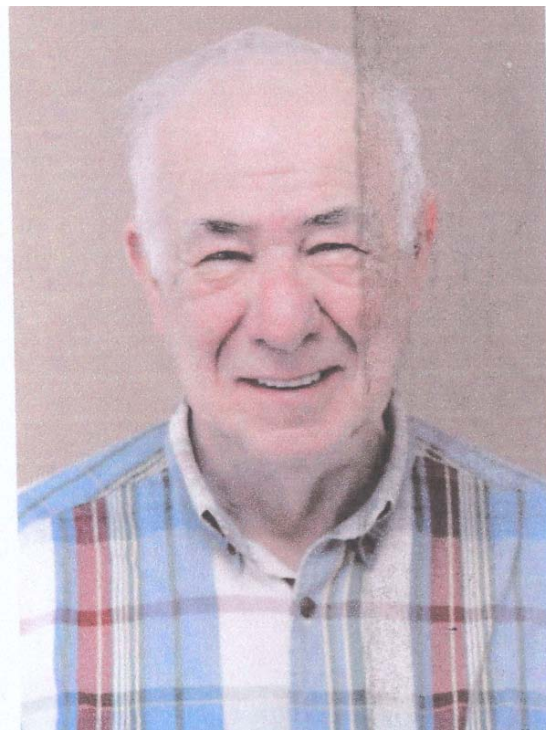


Leopold Lowy pictured as a 12 year old boy in orphanage.



Leopold Lowy is no stranger to tragedy. Orphaned as a young boy, Leo spent two years of his life in a Jewish Orphanage in the Nazi-occupied Czech city of Prague. In 1942, Leo's life took a dangerous turn for the worse as he was sent to the Terezin concentration camp. Passing through "death camps" such as Auschwitz and Buchenwald, Lowy was a firsthand witness and a near-victim of one of humanity's greatest crimes.
