Judy Swimmer, a long time township resident and well known library employee, passed away at her home in Atco on May 16th. Born Judith Steiner in Cracow, Poland on October 21, 1927, Judy was taken by the Germans in 1939 and was finally liberated at Bergen-Belsen at the end of the war. Judy operated a chicken and egg farm with her husband Henry, while also attending Rutgers, working as an engineer and raising a daughter. After retiring, she started working in the library. Eager to help everyone who came to the Library, Judy was loved by all and will be remembered by her many friends for her sincere and warm personality. She is survived by a daughter, Regina Brown, four grandchildren, several great grandchildren, and will be missed by her many friends. Judy often attended Temple Beth El in Hammonton and was one of the last Jewish survivors of the Holocaust in Southern New Jersey.
