^{*} The Commissioner clarifies the ALJ's discussion at page 3 of the initial decision by noting that awards under *N.J.S.A.* 18A:30-2.1 are not *necessarily* conditioned upon presentation of a Workers' Compensation claim, as, for example, when the duration of the absence is insufficiently long to be eligible for such presentation. See *Steven B. Hern v. Board of Education of the City of Union City, Hudson County*, decided by the Commissioner May 8, 1991, aff'd State Board of Education August 7, 1991, rev'd and remanded Appellate Division, A-339-91T3, October 23, 1992, remanded State Board of Education March 3, 1993.
