SYNOPSIS

Petitioning Education Association and certified school nurses alleged that the Board retained unqualified, uncertified nurses in violation of statute and in violation of their rights.

ALJ found that there was no genuine issue as to any material fact as the parties and facts in this case were essentially the same as in two prior cases that were already litigated. ALJ determined that the fundamental principles of *res judicata* and collateral estoppel precluded petitioners from further litigating this matter. ALJ granted respondent's motion for summary decision. Petition was dismissed.

Commissioner adopted findings and determination in initial decision as his own.

Consequently, the Commissioner adopts as his own the recommended order of the Administrative Law Judge granting the Old Bridge Board of Education's Motion for Summary Decision and dismissing the Petition of Appeal. *
