SYNOPSIS

Petitioner appealed the audit decision of respondent determining that transactions between petitioner and the Passaic County Elks Crippled Children's Committee, Inc. are between related parties and not arm's length transactions and requiring petitioner to change its name to remove any reference to Elks, remove any members of the Elks from its Board of Trustees and amend its constitution and by-laws.

The ALJ granted summary decision to respondent, finding that there were no genuine issues of material fact and respondent was entitled to prevail as a matter of law.

The Commissioner concurred with and adopted as his own the recommendation of the ALJ to dismiss the petition.
