SYNOPSIS

Petitioner challenged the Board's determination to deny him a high school diploma because he was deemed academically ineligible to complete a required physics course due to excessive unexcused absences.

The ALJ found the Board's determination to be appropriate and in conformance with its policy regarding chronic illness that may cause chronic absences and/or lateness to school. The ALJ rejected petitioner's assertion that he had demonstrated a medical basis for his persistent and chronic absences.

The Commissioner adopted the Initial Decision as the final decision in this matter. Petition was dismissed.
