SYNOPSIS

This matter is on remand from the State Board of Education for a determination of whether the purchase of land by the Board with surplus was valid, in light of the State Board's determination that voter approval of the use of surplus to purchase land is required.

The ALJ determined, based on the testimony and evidence presented, that the voters were informed of the land purchase and the use of surplus to effectuate the same, and thus, that the purchase should not be disturbed. The ALJ concluded that the matter should be closed.

The Commissioner affirmed the decision of the ALJ, concluding that, based on the unique circumstances and sequence of events herein, the purchase of land should remain undisturbed.

The record of this matter and the Initial Decision of the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) have been reviewed. The parties did not file exceptions to the Initial Decision.

Commissioner transmits this matter to the State Board of Education, which has retained jurisdiction.
