SYNOPSIS

The School Ethics Commission found probable cause to credit the allegation that Rosemary Jackson violated the School Ethics Act by voting to approve a bill list that contained a bill of her employer. The Commission and Jackson reached a settlement wherein they agreed that Jackson inadvertently violated the School Ethics Act, and that the Commission would recommend a penalty of reprimand to the Commissioner.

The Acting Commissioner issued a decision imposing a penalty of reprimand for the violation of the School Ethics Act.

The record and Settlement Agreement containing the School Ethics Commission's recommendation that respondent be reprimanded for a violation of *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-24(c), because she inadvertently voted on a bill list containing a bill of her employer, have been reviewed.

Upon such review, pursuant to the provisions of *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-29c, the Commissioner hereby accepts the penalty recommended by the Commission.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that Rosemary Jackson be reprimanded as a school official found to have violated *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-24(c).
