SYNOPSIS

Petitioner sought a determination that she was entitled to sick leave injury benefits under N.J.S.A.18A:30-2.1 and reimbursement of the sick leave charged to her for the period from October 31, 2005, through January 30, 2006. The Board denied that petitioner's injury was work-related and that her leave time beginning on October 31, 2005 was due to any work-related injury. Petitioner's workers' compensation claim was settled without petitioner having asserted a claim for lost wages.

The ALJ dismissed the petition, concluding that: 1) the matter was appropriately decided on a summary basis, since there were no genuine issues of material fact; 2) petitioner failed to prove the existence of a causal connection between the injury in question and the prior work injury from which she contended it arose; and 3) petitioner waived any right she might have had under N.J.S.A. 18A:30-2.1 by failing to pursue a claim for lost wages in Workers' Compensation Court.

The Commissioner concurred with the ALJ's recommendations and adopted the Initial Decision as the final decision in this matter.
