Synopsis

Petitioner, a member of the Board of Education of the West Windsor-Plainsboro Board of Education, alleged that respondent, a fellow Board member, violated *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-24.1(g) of the School Ethics Act when he forwarded a message to members of his immediate family about an incident involving a student that resulted in discipline. The matter was heard in the Office of Administrative Law in December 2018, and the ALJ issued an Initial Decision concluding that the respondent's actions violated the confidentiality provision of *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-24.1(g), and that a penalty of reprimand was warranted. The School Ethics Commission (SEC) adopted the findings of fact and conclusions of the ALJ, but rejected the ALJ's penalty recommendation, determining instead that censure is the appropriate penalty in this case.

Upon review, the Commissioner concurred with the penalty recommendation of the SEC. Accordingly, the respondent shall be censured as a school official found to have violated the School Ethics Act.

The record of this matter and the decision of the School Ethics Commission (SEC) have

been reviewed. The SEC found that respondent violated N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24.1(g) when he forwarded a

message to members of his immediate family about an incident involving a student that resulted in

discipline (which was subsequently shared by a family member with countless others), and recommended

a penalty of censure. The SEC's decision was forwarded pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:12-29 for the

Commissioner's final determination on the recommended penalty. Respondent did not file exceptions to

the recommended penalty, nor was the SEC's underlying finding of a violation appealed to the

Commissioner pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:4.

Upon review, the Commissioner concurs with the penalty recommended by the SEC.

Accordingly, the respondent shall be censured as a school official found to have violated the School

Ethics Act.
