New Jersey Commissioner of Education Final Decision

In the Matter of Kecia Teller, The John P. Holland Charter School, Passaic County.

The Commissioner has reviewed the record of this matter and the decision of the School Ethics Commission (SEC), finding that respondent violated the School Ethics Act for failure to timely complete charter school trustee training in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-33, *N.J.A.C.* 6A:28-4.1, and *N.J.A.C.* 6A:11-3.1. The SEC's decision was forwarded to the Commissioner for final determination on the recommended penalty pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 18A:12-29(c). The SEC advises that respondent ultimately completed the training after the issuance of its October 25, 2019 Order to Show Cause, but prior to the SEC's November 19, 2019 meeting; however, the SEC notes that respondent was previously reprimanded in 2017 for failing to timely comply with the statutory requirement to complete ethics training. Due to the repeated failure to comply with her statutory obligation, the SEC recommends that respondent be suspended for 30 days. Respondent has neither filed exceptions to the recommended penalty nor instituted an appeal of the SEC's underlying finding of violation, pursuant to *N.J.A.C.* 6A:4-1 et seq.

Upon review, the Commissioner concurs with the penalty recommended by the SEC for respondent's failure to timely honor an obligation placed upon charter school trustees by law. Additionally, respondent is admonished for causing the unnecessary expenditure of administrative and adjudicative resources at both State and local levels.

Accordingly, respondent is hereby suspended from her position, as of the date of this decision, for violating the School Ethics Act.
