STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Petitioner, D.P., sought emergent temporary relief on behalf of her son D.V.P. compelling respondent to take all steps necessary to protect D.V.P. from harassment, intimidation, and bullying ("HIB") including removing four of his classmates from all

classes that D.V.P. attends for the remainder of the school year. Petitioner alleges that respondent violated The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act, N.J.S.A. 18A:37-1 et seq., and Board Policy #5512 titled, "Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying" by failing to open an HIB Investigation or taking any other actions to protect D.V.P. from ongoing harassment, intimidation, and bullying. Petitioner claimed that there is a reasonable likelihood that D.V.P. would suffer immediate and irreparable harm if the requested Emergent Relief was not granted.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Petitioner filed a Verified Petition of Appeal on April 25, 2023 seeking Emergent Relief to protect her minor child, who is an eight-grade student within the North Arlington School District ("District") from ongoing harassment, intimidation, and bullying. On April 28, 2023, respondent filed a Verified Answer along with opposition to the Motion for Emergent Relief and a Cross-Motion to Dismiss petitioner's appeal, without prejudice. The request for Emergent Relief and Motion to Dismiss was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law by the New Jersey Department of Education for consideration. The parties' written submissions were considered followed by oral argument of counsel beginning on May 1, 2023 and continuing, at the request of counsel, on May 8, 2023. The record was closed on May 8, 2023 after the oral arguments were presented. On May 23, 2023 an Order was entered denying petitioner's claim for Emergent Relief and the parties have agreed that no other issues remain now that petitioner's request for emergent relief has been resolved.

LEGAL ANALYISIS

The only issues before this tribunal in this matter were petitioner's Motion for Emergent Relief and respondent's Cross Motions relating to it. I **FIND**, and the parties agree, that the May 23, 2023 Order Denying Petitioner's Motion and respondents Cross-Motions (See Exhibit A) resolve all issues and I **CONCLUDE** that this matter should be dismissed.
