

New Jersey Commissioner of Education

Final Decision

In the Matter of the Suspension of the
Teaching Certificate of Maegan Sinisi, Board of
Education of the South Orange-Maplewood
School District, Essex County

This matter was opened before the Commissioner of Education on October 29, 2025, by way of an Order to Show Cause (OSC) served by petitioner, Board of Education of the South Orange-Maplewood School District (Board), upon respondent, Maegan Sinisi, requiring respondent to show cause why an order should not be entered suspending her pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:26-10.

By notice dated November 10, 2025, the Office of Controversies and Disputes (Office) acknowledged proof that the OSC had been served upon respondent and directed her to answer within 20 days. No answer having been received, on December 1, 2025, the Office sent respondent a notice via email directing her to file an answer within ten days. The notice advised that, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3-1.5(e), failure to answer would cause each allegation in petitioner's papers to be deemed admitted and might result in summary decision by the Commissioner. No answer having been received, on January 7, 2026, the Office sent respondent another notice – via regular and certified mail – again directing her to file an answer within ten days.

On January 12, 2026, the Office received an email from respondent, indicating that she was not contesting the suspension.

The petition and supporting exhibits in this matter indicate respondent was a tenured teacher in the South Orange-Maplewood School District. In her capacity as a teacher, respondent was required to adhere to all statutes of the State of New Jersey, rules of the New Jersey Board of Education, and policies of the South Orange-Maplewood School District; among her duties was the statutory requirement that respondent provide at least sixty days' notice to the Board prior to vacating her tenured position.

However, on September 17, 2025, respondent sent correspondence to the Board indicating that she was resigning effective September 16, 2025 – well short of the sixty day-notice required by *N.J.S.A. 18A:28-8*. Respondent has not denied these allegations; therefore, the Commissioner deems such allegations to be admitted pursuant to *N.J.A.C. 6A:3-1.5(a)* and further deems them sufficient to justify suspension of respondent's teaching certificate pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 18A:26-10*.

Accordingly, summary decision is hereby granted to petitioner, and respondent's teaching certificate, and any substitute teaching credential she may hold, is suspended for a period of one year from the filing date of this decision, a copy of which shall be forwarded to the State Board of Examiners for implementation of the suspension.
