: RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the School Ethics Act, N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21 et seq. was enacted by the New Jersey State Legislature to ensure and preserve public confidence in school board members and school administrators and to provide specific ethical standards to guide their conduct; and

**WHEREAS, N.J.S.A.** 18A:12-33 requires new board members to attend training within one year of election or appointment to the board to gain the skills and knowledge necessary to serve as a school board member; and

**WHEREAS,** William Mennen was elected to serve a three-year term on the Somerset Hills Board of Education on April 15, 1996; and

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA) advises prospective board members of the training requirement in the "candidate kit" before they are elected and mails correspondence to all new board members who have failed to register for or attend an orientation and did mail such correspondence to this board member on February 13, 1997; and

**WHEREAS,** at the request of the School Ethics Commission, the NJSBA published a notice with the heading "Last Chance to Meet Training Requirements" on the front page of the February 21, 1997 edition of *School Board Notes* advising that the March 15, 1997 session was the last that new board members could attend without penalty; and

**WHEREAS**, the NJSBA conducted seven training sessions between April 1996 and April 1997 at varying locations and continuously published the dates and times of the sessions; and

WHEREAS, the last training session to fulfill the requirement was held on March 15, 1997; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission issued an Order on March 27, 1997, directing William Mennen to Show Cause why he had not attended training up until that time; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mennen replied that he could not attend the March session for which he was scheduled because he was out of state for a client consultation; and

**WHEREAS**, the next available session that the New Jersey School Boards Association offers is the June 6-8, 1997 session and Mr. Mennen is on the waiting list for that session; and

**WHEREAS,** the Commission notified Mr. Mennen that the Commission would discuss this matter at its May 27, 1997 meeting, that he had the right to attend, and he could be found in violation of the School Ethics Act and receive a penalty up to removal; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mennen has failed to attend the required training program for the one year allowed; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission finds that his failure to attend board member training from April 1996 to April 1997 constitutes a violation of N.J.S.A. 18A:12-33; and

**WHEREAS,** Mr. Mennen's response does not provide an adequate explanation of why he failed to attend the required training session for the year allowed by law; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission finds that if Mr. Mennen fails to attend either the June 6-8, 1997 session or the June 20-22, 1997 session, the Commission finds that it would be appropriate to have him removed from the board;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the School Ethics Commission finds that William Mennen violated N.J.S.A. 18A:12-33 of the School Ethics Act and recommends that the Commissioner of Education impose a reprimand if he attends either June session, but removal from the board if he does not attend either June training session.
