The decision of the Commissioner of Education to dismiss the respondent from his tenured employment is affirmed for the reasons expressed therein. We fully agree with the Commissioner that the pattern of improper conduct exhibited by the respondent constitutes unbecoming conduct and warrants his dismissal. In this respect, we stress in particular our concerns about the incidents in which the respondent left his classroom unattended.

In addition, although our determination rests solely on the respondent's pattern of unbecoming conduct, we also remind the Trenton Board of its obligation to assure that teaching staff members are observed, evaluated and provided with professional improvement plans in accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6:3-4.1 et seq.
