Nine New Jersey Schools Earn National Blue Ribbon Award from U.S. Department of Education

Trenton, NJ – Today the U.S. Department of Education announced that nine New Jersey public schools earned the Blue Ribbon designation for high student achievement and quality programs.

"Today, we congratulate the schools from New Jersey that have earned the U.S. Department of Education's prestigious Blue Ribbon Schools award," said New Jersey Education Commissioner Lamont O. Repollet. "This recognition is conveyed to schools for overall academic achievement or for closing achievement gaps. National Blue Ribbon Schools are honored at an annual awards ceremony in Washington, D.C., where each receives a plaque and flag to signify its exemplary status.
