Seton Hall is a major Catholic university. In a diverse and collaborative environment, it focuses on academic and ethical development. Seton Hall students are prepared to be leaders in their professional and community lives, in a global society, and are challenged by outstanding faculty, an evolving technologically advanced setting and values-centered curricula. The College of Education and Human Services is one of seven colleges, the others being Arts and Sciences, Business, Diplomacy, Health and Medical Sciences, Law, and Nursing. The university offers over 90 programs and certificates and serves approximately 9,800 students (5,500 undergraduates and 4,300 graduates).

The mission of the College of Education and Human Services is to prepare highly competent, socially conscious, reflective professionals. The college provides three undergraduate teacher education programs in integrated elementary and special education, secondary education (with an option of dual certification in special education), and a dual degree program with a bachelor's degree in elementary and special education and a master's in speech pathology. There are approximately 60 program completers each year, about 40% immediately enter graduate school as part of the dual degree program. As the oldest diocesan university in the country, Seton Hall is a strong supporter of Catholic education. Some of our program completers seek employment in private Catholic schools or in other service oriented programs such as Teach for America. Candidates complete extensive field experiences in sophomore and junior year, prior to the culminating clinical experience, in a range of settings including public, parochial, urban, and special education. Seton Hall is a leader in technology and learning. Faculty and teacher candidates use technology to model, deepen, and increase student directed learning.
