## Convening

State Board of Education President Kathy Goldenberg convened the public meeting at 9:09 a.m. with the reading of the statement pertaining to the public session of the State Board meeting as it complies with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act.

The Open Public Meetings Act was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meeting of public bodies at which any business affecting their interest is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the State Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Department of Education, Secretary of State's Office and notice also having been given to the State House Press Corps, the Governor's Office and the State Board agenda subscribers.

And seeing there was a quorum, the meeting of December 2, 2020, called to order.

# Pledge of Allegiance

## **Approval of Minutes of The Meetings**

On a motion duly seconded and carried, the State Board members approved the minutes of the public meeting conducted on November 4, 2020. State Board member Fatimah Burnam-Watkins abstained.

# **President's Reports**

President Goldenberg welcomed everyone to the State Board's virtual meeting and extended her best wishes on behalf of the State Board that all are safe and healthy.

# **Public Testimony**

President Goldenberg stated that the State Board would receive testimony today on the readoption with amendments pertaining to Chapter 16, Programs to Support Student Development. She also stated that going forward the State Board would only accept written testimony on administrative code items currently pending before the State Board.

## **Report of the Permanent Student Representative**

President Goldenberg introduced and welcomed the State Board of Education's permanent student representative, Sabrina Capoli. Sabrina is a senior at Seneca High School in Burlington County. President Goldenberg stated that Sabrina would not provide a report this month.

#### **State Board Committee Reports**

## **Social Emotional Committee**

Fatimah Burnam-Watkins, chair, Social Emotional Committee, stated that the Social Emotional Committee met on October 28, 2020. She stated that the State Board members in attendance via Microsoft Teams for the meeting, including herself, were Kathy Goldenberg, ex officio, Mary

Beth Berry, and Elaine Bobrove. Ms. Burnam-Watkins also stated that the Department staff in attendance were Acting Commissioner Angelica Allen-McMillan, Paula Bloom, Kelly Allen, Diane Shoener, Beth Auerswald and Stephanie Russo.

Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated that they met to discuss the Department's concerns surrounding the emotional well-being of our students. She stated the Department has put together a compilation of resources targeted toward how educators and parents can help students during this uncertain time. Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated some of the data centered around student's anxiety, depression and potential increased suicide rates that are similar to data collected after Hurricane Sandy. She stated the data showed impact of trauma, job loss, and increases in substance abuse and child abuse. She stated the Department partnered with law enforcement to make sure they were on top of and aware of the numbers that are surging at this time. Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated that the Department collaborated with the Department of Children and Families, the Department of Health, education associations and county offices, and they have added resources the Department's website. She stated there has been a lot of positive feedback on the resources that are available. Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated they talked about the need to reach out to the school teams who are expressing the stress that teachers are experiencing since last spring with all that has been happening in their world as educators. She stated the Department facilitated a series of community meetings where they met with school teams and provided them with instruction in a place of collaboration and community support around all things social and emotional. She stated they discussed how educators can build upon their social and emotional skills, as well as how students can increase their skills. Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated they talked about a few of the initiatives that the Department is working on. She stated they are focusing on the school climate survey, which was developed in 2012 and since has been revised to better align with things like growth mindset, empathy, relationships and student voice. She stated it is a research-based survey in which they are in a partnership with Rutgers University, and they will be giving us an update on the data from the school climate survey. Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated they are also working on the "Handle with Care" initiative, which is a collaboration between the Department, the Office of the Attorney General, and law enforcement. A symposium took place on November 17 that provided a toolkit that introduces SEL competencies and on how to embed SEL in instruction. She stated the goal is to build out foundational support and planning, and to strengthen adult SEL competencies and capacity to promote SEL with their students. She stated that the committee talked about how they can increase SEL resources for parents since they are home with their children a lot more. She stated that the committee discussed not only how to teach educators and school leaders, but how to engage parents so they recognize some of the signs of trauma and can be educated about the available tools and resources. She also stated they talked about ways of engaging with students directly and ways to partner with the State Board's student representative, Sabrina Capoli. She stated that Sabrina could reach out to students so the committee can better understand how students are doing while living in the virtual/hybrid world, and how it is affecting their social and emotional learning and what needs they have that may have been missed. Mrs. Burnam-Watkins stated that she is looking forward to scheduling a follow up meeting to learn about the symposium, as well as discussing ways they can build out plans for 2021.

#### **Assessment Committee**

President Goldenberg stated that the Assessment Committee met on November 18, 2020, and that Mr. Arcelio Aponte, chair would provide a report at the next meeting.

#### **Annual Report of the State Operated School District of Camden**

Acting Commissioner Allen-McMillan welcomed Katrina McCombs, Superintendent of Camden City School District, to the State Board meeting.

Ms. McCombs presented a report to the State Board members outlining the vision, initiatives and supports in place in the Camden City School District. The presentation included the vision for the district and why as well as the district's priorities and goals. The four overarching priorities include accelerating student achievement; ensuring great teachers and staff are in all roles; building safe schools for 21<sup>st</sup> century success; and ensuring a financially responsible and fiscally sustainable school district. Ms. McCombs also presented the highlights and gaps for the last 18 months. Ms. McCombs also presented progress in the areas of instruction and programs and fiscal management as noted by increased performance over time using the State monitoring tool (DPR) of the New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum.
