Purpose of N.J.A.C. 6A:3

- The rules establish procedures for the filing of petitions with the Commissioner to hear and determine all controversies and disputes arising under the school laws, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:6-9.
- The rules also establish special procedures for specific types of controversies, including, but not limited to:
 - Tenure charges (N.J.S.A. 18A:6-10)
 - Denials of entitlement to attend school due to residency laws (N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1)



Key Areas in Chapter 3

- 1. Filing and answering petitions;
- 2. Filing and answering tenure charges;
- 3. Transmittal of cases to the Office of Administrative Law or an arbitrator; and
- 4. Issuance of written decisions.





General Overview: Goals of Proposed Amendments



- 1. Ensure consistency with current practice, particularly the significant increase in filings by email.
- 2. Provide clear direction to the public to make filing petitions easier, more efficient, and less costly.
- 3. Streamline the processing of petitions and improve the time period for transmitting matters to the Office of Administrative Law for further proceedings.





General Overview: Summary of Proposed Amendments



Changes include:

- Eliminating the requirement that filings be received by 4:15 P.M.
 - This provision has caused confusion for members of the public, and it is no longer necessary in light of the increased use of email filing.
- Eliminating notary requirements
 - As notaries may charge for their services, removing this provision makes filing a petition completely free.
- Eliminating requirements related to the use of filing by fax.
