Honoring Dr. Thelma Napoleon-Smith

On behalf of the State Board and the Department of Education, Vice President Goldenberg and Commissioner Repollet presented the family of Dr. Thelma Napoleon-Smith, a former State Board of Education Member, with a resolution honoring her service to New Jersey schools and her lifelong dedication to education.

On a motion duly seconded and carried, the State Board approved the following resolution read by State Board Member Ronald Butcher:

RESOLUTION IN HONOR OF DR. THELMA NAPOLEON-SMITH

WHEREAS, Dr. Thelma Napoleon-Smith worked for 36 years in Trenton Public Schools, beginning as a classroom teacher in 1963 then working as a principal for the district, and culminating her career as the director of elementary curriculum when she retired in 1999; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Napoleon-Smith served with distinction on the New Jersey State Board of Education from 2003 to 2007; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Napoleon-Smith exhibited her unwavering belief in a child's right to a quality education through her previous role as chair of the State Board Study Group, Implications of Desegregation on Student Achievement and the Community, that presented a comprehensive strategy to identify and eliminate all forms of discrimination in public education policies and programs; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Napoleon-Smith advocated for educational opportunities for all children regardless of their socioeconomic status or race; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Napoleon-Smith's late mother, Berline Williams, helped desegregate Trenton's public schools in the 1940s, shaping her daughter's education and career; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Napoleon-Smith received the Administrator of the Year Award in 1996 from the National Association of University Women and the Women in Education Award in 1997 from Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.; and now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the New Jersey State Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education recognize and posthumously honor Dr. Napoleon-Smith's commitment to the children of New Jersey and her lifelong dedication to education.
