About Farm to School

The New Jersey Department of Agriculture has partnered with NJ farmers to develop the Jersey Fresh Farm to School Program. The farm to school program includes school garden activities, "which help teach students where food comes from by growing it themselves. Students benefit by learning the science behind farming and the nutritional values of fresh products and gain a greater understanding and appreciation of the environment. Educators can use school garden programs to teach any subject - math, science, language arts, health and nutrition, art or social studies. Farm to School programs promote and create a sense of community for all involved" (Farm to School, 2023).

Farm to School: A Special Education Spotlight

The Randolph Township Schools Adult Skills Post-Secondary

Transition Program is designed to address and support transition goals. Students participate in a variety of work readiness and independent living activities which include job sampling, navigating transportation and daily living. The program consists of a partnership between the school, student, family and the community. The anticipated outcome for each student is to gain awareness, experience and better participate in the adult world with an appropriate action plan. Farm to School participating students experience a farmer's market by "selling" produce to the families in the community. They even experience utilizing the produce through weekly menu development and preparing/cooking meals as part of their functional, daily life skill development.
