Re: Continuous Improvement Visit Response

As a result of discussions that took place during the United States Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs' (USDE OSEP) Continuous Improvement Visit in October 2011, the New Jersey Office of Special Education (NJOSE) has made changes to its electronic grant administration system to ensure compliance with 34 CFR §300.203. Although noncompliance with this provision was not identified in the USDE OSEP's March verification letter, the NJOSE took preemptive steps to ensure compliance with the regulation.

Federal regulation 34 CFR §300.203 requires that funds provided to an LEA must not be used to reduce the level of expenditures for the education of children with disabilities made by the LEA from local funds below the level of those expenditures for the preceding fiscal year. The state must ensure LEA compliance with this requirement. The LEA may use local funds only or a combination of state and local funds. The state must permit the LEA to demonstrate compliance with 34 CFR §300.203 by comparing the total or per capita amount of local funds the LEA budgeted for the education of children with disabilities in the grant year with the total or per capita amount of local funds that the LEA spent for the education of children with disabilities in the most recent preceding fiscal year for which data are available.

While the NJOSE always allowed states this flexibility, the electronic grant administration system did not include the per capita option in its maintenance of effort worksheet. The state is in the process of moving to a new electronic grant system, the System for Administering Grants Electronically (SAGE). This system, which will be utilized by LEAs for the 2013 IDEA grant application process, includes the per capita method for calculating maintenance of effort. A screenshot from the grant application is included with this letter.

## **Reasons for MOE Reduction**
