Subject: Special Education Monitoring Report- Middlesex Borough School District

This correspondence has been sent to inform you of the results of the New Jersey Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs' onsite monitoring regarding the Middlesex Borough School District's implementation of federal and state special education requirements. Between June 24 and December 21, 2009, the New Jersey Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs (NJOSEP), monitored the district to determine compliance with federal and state special education requirements. The members of the monitoring team were Nicole Buten and Debbie Masarsky.

The special education monitoring system is data driven and aligned with the federally required State Performance Plan (SPP) incicators, including the federal monitoring priorities established by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2004 (IDEA 2004). Specifically, the NJOSEP monitoring process is focused on improving educational results and functional outcomes for students with disabilities and ensuring compliance with those special education requirements related to positive student outcomes.

The special education self-assessment and monitoring process focused on requirements related to the following areas:

- Transition to Adult Life
- State Assessment
- Discipline Procedures
- Placement in the Least Restrictive Environment
- Parent Involvement
- Disproportionate Representation of Specific Racial-Ethnic Groups in Special Education
- Evaluation and Reevaluation
- Individualized Education Program
- Programs and Services

The Middlesex Borough School District was randomly selected for the self-assessment/monitoring process.
