Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Paul Barbato at 9:34 a.m.

Approvals – Minutes

The October minutes were reviewed and approved.

Office of Special Education Updates

- Formal Vote:
 - O When reviewing indicators 4a and 4b, the council was presented with a series of scenarios to propose lowing the N-Size, cell size, and risk ratio. The formal vote, using mentimeter, was as follows:
 - 79% of the council voted to change the N-size to 20, the cell size to 3, and the risk ratio to 2.5x the state rate.
 - 11% requested not to change the current N-size, cell size, and risk ratio.
 - 11% abstained from voting.
 - When discussing the targets for 4a and 4b, it was proposed to either wait until the OSE establishes baseline to set targets for FY24 and FY25, or the set targets for FY23, without baseline data. The formal vote, using mentimeter, was as follows:
 - 88% proposed to wait to set targets and keep the current targets "as is".
 - 6% to set targets for FY23, FY24 and FY25 without baseline data.
 - 6% abstained from voting.

Council Discussion -

Old Business

Council members were reminded that there is no December meeting and that the January meeting is hybrid (in-person/virtual).

Council members were provided a link to the Dispute Resolution Findings.

The Director from the Office of Special Education and the Office of Student Support Services responded to the recommendations brought forth by the Social, Emotional, and Behavioral Well-Being for Students with Disabilities Priority Subcommittee. The results of the recommendations were:

- One (1) recommendation was accepted.
- Two (2) recommendations were accepted with edits
- Two (2) recommendations were returned for deeper study.

New Business

Council members were reminded that there is no December meeting and that the January meeting will be hybrid (in-person/virtual).

Jocelyn Gottlieb, assistant chairperson, requested that parent members consider joining the engagement committee to discuss ways to bring the parent voice forward as part of the council meetings and discussions.

Priority subcommittee leads gave their committee updates and reports.
