It is essential that New Jersey use its IEP and MEP to begin the transition to carbon-free energy. It is also therefore essential that there be changes to the IEP to make that possible, including

- including the social cost of carbon and fossil fuels
- front load emissions restrictions, to make sure the GHG reductions come as quickly as possible
- draft models to make sure that energy in NJ is carbon free as rapidly as possible, with the goal of a 45% cut no later than 2030
- an immediate moratorium on all fossil fuel infrastructure
- meaningful public input
- inclusion of accurate estimates of the effects of short-lived pollutants, like methane and black carbon
- flexibility in implementation.
