Re: Waiver to the Provisions of N.J.S.A. 52:13D-17.2(b)

Dear Ms. Chowdhry:

At its September 29, 2020 meeting, the State Ethics Commission considered your request on behalf of Zachary Ehrlich, Manufactured Food Regulatory Coordinator, Department of Health, whose partner, Trevor Sterling, is currently employed by Caesar's Entertainment as the Director of Internal Audit. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth below, the Commission granted a waiver of the general prohibition of section 17.2(b).

Generally, Section 17.2(b) of the Conflicts Law prohibits all State officers and employees and members of their immediate families from holding an interest in, holding employment with, representing, appearing for, or negotiating on behalf of the holder of, or applicant for, a casino license or any holding or intermediary company with respect thereto. However, the statute also contains the following exception language:

> except that ... a member of the immediate family of a State officer or employee, or person, may hold employment with the holder of, or applicant for, a casino license if, in the judgment of the State Ethics Commission ... such employment will not interfere with the responsibilities of the State officer or employee, or person, and will not create a conflict of interest, or reasonable risk of the public perception of a conflict of interest, on the part of the State officer or employee, or person ....

The Commission agrees that there is no conflict between Mr. Ehrlich's position at the Department of Health and his partner's employment with Caesar's Entertainment. Mr. Ehrlich's position and Page 2 October 1, 2020

his partner's employment do not overlap, and there is no conflict of interest or reasonable risk of the public perceiving any kind of conflict between his position and his partner's casino employment.

Based on the facts and circumstances set forth above, the Commission granted the waiver of the general prohibition of section 17.2(b) in the case of Zachary Ehrlich and his partner, Trevor Sterling.
