DECISION

This matter arises from allegations that Dr. Ghousia Hashmi, Chief of Medicine, Trenton Psychiatric Hospital ("TPH"), Department of Human Services: (1) used her position to provide unwarranted privileges or advantages to an endocrine consultant for TPH and a pharmaceutical company by directing her subordinates to attend a lecture given by the consultant and sponsored by the pharmaceutical company; (2) accepted prohibited gifts by consuming food and beverages at the lecture that were provided by the pharmaceutical company; and (3) instructed her subordinates to lie during their interviews with the Commission staff in this matter.

After considering the results of an investigation into the allegations, the Commission **dismissed** the matter pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:61-3.1(g).
