Re: Waiver to the Provisions of *N.J.S.A.* 52:13D-17.2(b)

Dear Ms. Ward:

At its October 20 2015 meeting, the State Ethics Commission considered your request on behalf of Wilfredo Rodrigucz, Maintenance Worker, Special Improvement Division, Casino Reinvestment Development Authority ("CRDA"), who is employed part-time as a steward at Trump Taj Mahal. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth below, the Commission granted a waiver of the general prohibition of section 17.2(b).

Generally, Section 17.2(b) of the Conflicts Law prohibits all State officers and employees and members of their immediate families from holding an interest in, holding employment with, representing, appearing for, or negotiating on behalf of the holder of, or applicant for, a casino license or any holding or intermediary company with respect thereto. However, the statute also contains the following exception language:

> except that... if, in the judgment of the State Ethics Commission ... such employment will not interfere with the responsibilities of the State officer or employee, or person, and will not create a conflict of interest, or reasonable risk of the public perception of a conflict of interest, on the part of the State officer or employee, or person

The Commission agrees that there is no conflict between Mr. Rodriguez's position at CRDA and his employment with Trump Taj Mahal. His casino employment will not interfere with

bis responsibility at CRDA and will not create a conflict of interest or reasonable risk of the public perceiving any kind of conflict.

Based on the facts and circumstances set forth above, the Commission granted the waiver of the general prohibition of section 17.2(b) in the case of Wilfredo Rodriguez.
