WHEREAS, addiction is a disease and the stigma associated with addiction must be addressed so that no one feels shame or disgrace over a drug overdose; and

WHEREAS, prescription drug overdose is now the number one cause of accidental death in the nation, surpassing car accidents for the first time; and

WHEREAS, according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, 113 people die as a result of a drug overdose and another 6,748 are treated in emergency departments for the misuse or abuse of drugs every day in the United States; and

WHEREAS, by acknowledging all those who have been affected by overdose, we help the general public understand its effects on New Jersey's communities; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse remains committed to raising awareness in order to combat stigma and educate New Jersey's communities about overdose prevention;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CHRIS CHRISTIE, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim:

AUGUST 31, 2014 AS OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY

in New Jersey and urge all residents to learn about this disease and to aid and support those who are affected by it.
