WHO IS COVERED BY DANIEL'S LAW?

- Active, formerly active, and retired Judicial Officers, Law Enforcement Officers, Child Protective Investigators in the Division of Child Protection and Permanency, Prosecutors, and their Immediate Family Members residing in the same household with them.
- (N.J.S.A. 47:1B-1 et seq., P.L. 2023, c. 113)



OIP: Portal for Covered Persons Opened 7/12/22 www.danielslaw.nj.gov

OIP Covered Person Process:

- 1. Covered Person applies, using their myNewJersey account, and provides proof of their qualifying title and employment, and Pension ID number. OIP reviews all and verifies Covered Person.
- 2. Following verification, Covered Person re-enters, provides home address information and the names of immediate family members residing in the same household with them. OIP then approves the Covered Person.

Are You A Redactor?

Redactors are appointed by their State, county, or municipal agency to remove the home address information of Covered Persons from the records the agency posts on its website.

(Names may be redacted from certain records held by Tax entities - Division of Taxation, county tax board, county tax administrator, county and municipal tax assessors.)



Redactors' Qualifications

- OPRA Custodians, Privacy Officers, trusted staff
- Appoint multiple Redactors based on type and depth of residential data your agency publicly posts.
- Essential: Redactors must at all times be respectful of the confidentiality of the data to be redacted and mindful of the need to preserve that confidentiality when they identify and redact it.



Redactors' Roles and Responsibilities

- If you are appointed, register as a Redactor with the OIP and receive approval Have a back up!
- Be familiar with the law Review with agency counsel
- Locate the residential data your agency posts
- Determine <u>your</u> process for redactions
- Return to the Portal for redaction notices and process them

Daniel's Law for Redactors

In November 2020, Governor Murphy signed Daniel's Law, which amended the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) and other statutes protecting personal information for certain persons in public service. Specifically, Daniel's Law is designed to expand protections from public exposure for personal information about active and retired judges, law enforcement officers, and prosecutors, and their immediate family members. Redactors appointed at state, county and municipal government levels are responsible for carrying out these protections.

Daniel's Law Website Search Assistant:

Aids Redactors in locating OIP-approved Covered Persons' information on their public facing websites.

Redactor enters into the system a web address where their posted data appears. The Search Assistant then continuously searches those web addresses for Covered Persons' names and residence information identified in their redaction requests and provides those results to the Redactor.



If you are no longer an appointed Redactor, advise the OIP. Be sure an active redactor remains in place to address redaction requests.

OIP needs current and correct data to assure it is sending redaction notices to the right person.
