


Daniel's Law: Time to Comply

Sign Up, Sign In, Receive Notices and Redact



Introduction

Since July 12, 2022, the Office of Information Privacy has registered over 4,700 persons who are eligible to apply for redaction protections through the Daniel's Law Portal. We also have been meeting and working with State, county and municipal government agencies to support their preparations for compliance with this law. All must comply with Daniel's Law by January 12, 2023.

Daniel's Law

N.J.S.A. 47:1B-1 et seq (P.L. 2021, c. 371)

Director is to establish a secure portal for Covered and Authorized Persons, who will submit redaction requests of personal information from certain public records and websites.

OIP, DCA, OIT and CSI (Vendor) = Collaboration

WHO IS COVERED?

Active, Formerly Active, and Retired Federal and State Judicial Officers, Prosecutors and Law Enforcement Officers, and their Immediate Family Members <u>Residing with Them in the Same Household.</u>

Next Steps: Redact

State, county and municipal government agencies that post residential data on their public-facing websites must redact it for Covered Persons who have been approved for redaction by the OIP. This may extend to paper records in their control. The government agencies that post or control this data must be ready to initiate the redaction process at their levels. OIP has communicated to them the need to do two things to prepare for compliance:

1. Locate Residential Data

Where does your agency post residential info on its public-facing websites? Where does it maintain such data in addition to posting in on the Internet?

2. Appoint Agency Redactors

Select a staff member and at least one back-up to carry out redactor responsibilities.

Whom to Appoint as a Redactor?

- Suggestion: OPRA Custodians, Privacy Officers
- Appoint multiple redactors based on type and depth of residential data your agency publicly posts.
- Essential: Redactors must be respectful of the confidentiality of the data to be redacted, mindful of the need to preserve that confidentiality when they identify and redact it, and at all times in the future.

Keep in Mind

When you receive a redaction notice from the OIP, you have 30 days to respond and redact.
