Sample Notification Letter - Mumps Disease

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Dear [Parent, Teacher, School Administrator, Community Resident, etc]:
We have been notified by the Department of Health that one of our [students/employees] has been diagnosed with mumps. Public health and [school/company] officials are working together to protect the health and safety of all [students and/or staff]. The following information will help you understand the situation:
• Mumps is a contagious disease that is caused by a virus. It typically starts with fever, headache, muscle aches, tiredness, and loss of appetite. Then most people will have swelling of their salivary glands (often referred to as parotitis when the parotid gland, located in front and below the ear, swells). This is what causes the puffy cheeks and a tender, swollen jaw. In rare cases, mumps can cause more severe complications including orchitis (swollen or tender testicles) or oophoritis (tender ovaries).
 Mumps <u>spreads</u> through direct contact with saliva or respiratory droplets from the mouth nose, or throat. An infected person can spread the virus by coughing, sneezing, sharing items that may have saliva on them, or participating in close-contact activities with others
 Mumps can be prevented with <u>MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella) vaccine</u>. The mumps component of the MMR vaccine is about 88% effective after 2 doses.
 After exposure to the virus, it typically takes 16-18 days (sometimes as long as 25 days) before symptoms appear. Exposed persons should monitor for symptoms for 25 days, regardless of vaccination status.
 As a general rule, you can help prevent the spread of infectious diseases by washing hands frequently, covering nose and mouth with tissues when coughing or sneezing, not going to school or work while sick, and not sharing eating utensils, toothbrushes, cups, drinking glasses, or water bottles.

If additional cases of mumps occur at [school/company], persons without evidence of immunity to mumps may be excluded for up to 25 days as part of the NJDOH outbreak control guidelines.
