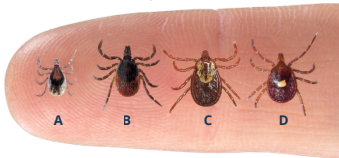

What to Do if You Find a Tick



Remove tick using
fine-tipped tweezers



If you remove an attached
deer tick that is swollen
with blood, call your
health care provider 



Clean the bite area



Call your doctor if you
become sick (fever,
headache, rash, muscle
aches, joint pains)
