

## **Contagious Rashes**



IMPETIGO
A bacterial infection of the skin that causes red, itchy sores that break open and leak fluid and turn into honey-colored scabs.



AUREUS (MRSA)
An infection caused by staph bacteria; often red, swollen, painful, warm to the touch, and filled with pus or drainage. Resistant to many antibiotics used to treat regular staph infections.



HAND, FOOT, AND MOUTH
DISEASE (COXSACKIE)
A viral infection that causes tiny
blisters usually in the mouth, or on
the hands or feet.



CHICKENPOX (VARICELLA)
Report within 24 Hours; Highly
Infectious
A viral infection that causes
small blisters across the body.



SCABIES
An infestation of mites that causes itchy red bumps or blisters found in skinfolds.



Report Immediately; Highly Infectious

A viral infection that causes redbrown spots that begins on the head and face and spreads downward.



**RINGWORM**A fungal infection that appears in a ring shape.



FIFTH DISEASE
(PARVOVIRUS B19)
A viral infection that causes a slapped cheek appearance.



MOLLUSCUM
A viral infection that causes fleshcolored lesions with a pit.
