

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND HEALTHY NEW JERSEY 2020



Mental Health and Substance Abuse were the number one concerns among New Jersey local health departments and regional hospital systems in their most recent community health (needs) assessments and improvement plans, and Behavioral Health/Mental Health/Substance Abuse was also the leading concern among participants at the 2015 Healthy New Jersey Regional Health Meetings. Based on these findings, along with the review of the mental health and substance abuse statistics below, the New Jersey Department of Health chose to add Behavioral Health to the state list of leading health priorities for the 2017-2020 State Health Improvement Plan.

The tables that follow show how New Jersey compares to the U.S. as a whole on **Healthy People 2020** Mental Health and Mental Disorders (MHMD) and Substance Abuse (SA) objectives for which New Jersey data exist.

* The Youth Risk Behavior Survey is only conducted in odd-numbered years. The 2015 NJ YRBS did not achieve a high enough overall response rate to receive <u>weighted results</u>. Therefore, results were not distributed. The 2013 NJ YRBS did not contain a question about suicide attempts that required medical attention.
