## **Extensions of the Data Use Agreement**

# EXTENSION OF THE DATA USE AGREEMENT

### BETWEEN

### THE STATE OF NEWJERSEY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

### AND

# THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF LAW AND PUBLIC SAFETY

This extension of the Data Use Agreement (DUA) entered into by and between the State of New Jersey, Department of Health (NJDOH), and the State of New Jersey, Department of Law and Public Safety (NJDLPS) (collectively, the "Parties") intended to confirm the mutual understanding and intention of the Parties, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a DUA on or about November 27, 2019, which provides for the sharing of certain Emergency Medical Services response information involving heroin and opiates to enable NJDLPS to support law enforcement efforts through the Drug Monitoring Initiative (DMI), Overdose Detection Mapping Application Program (ODMAP), and Integrated Drug Awareness Dashboard (IDAD), in order to lessen and prevent the threat of heroin and opiate overdoes to the public, as well as to administerfirst aid; and to enable NJDOH to support those public health initiatives and to use certain law enforcement datasets for integration into its New Jersey Opioid Data Dashboard; and

WHEREAS the Parties are discussing the creation of a new DUA to replace the existing DUA, which is scheduled to expire on November 27, 2022; and

WHEREAS the Parties wish to take all necessary steps to ensure that there is no gap in data sharing between NJDOH and NJSP in light of the current DUA expiration date of November 27, 2022; and

WHEREAS the Parties agree that Section XIX of the DUA permits them to extend the duration of the DUA upon mutual written agreement; and

WHEREAS the Parties wish to effectuate such anextension through this written agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties mutually agree as follows:

## 1. RECITALS

1.1 All of the above recitals are incorporated as part of this Extension.

## 2. PARTIES

2.1 The Parties to this Extension are the NJDOH and NJDLPS.

### 3. AUTHORITY

3.1 The Parties enter into this extension of the DUA pursuant to Section XIX of the DUA.

#### 4. EXTENSION

4.1 The Parties mutually agree to extend the expiration date of the DUA from November 27, 2022, to <u>May 31, 2023</u>, 5 p.m., thereby so extending the duration of the DUA.

# 5. **EFFECT ON THE DUA**

- 5.1 The Parties acknowledge and agree that except for extending duration of the DUA to May 31, 2023, 5 p.m., the DUA entered into on or about November 27, 2019, remains unchanged.
- 5.2 Any additional extensions of the DUA by the Parties shall also be effectuated in accordance with Section XIX.
- 5.3 This Extension shall be attached to the DUA as Attachment 4.
- 5.4 This Extension may be executed in duplicate original counterparts, and all such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same document.

The terms of this Extension have been read and understood by the persons whose signatures appear below and shall become effective upon execution by all parties.
