WHO WE ARE

The New Jersey Department of Health Children's Oral Health Program has provided age appropriate oral health education to school age children throughout the state for 40 years.

The Children's Oral Health Program provides a variety of oral health education programs and resources including:

- School-based education activities conducted by Registered Dental Hygienists/Dentists
- Resources for school nurses including the "Miles of Smiles" newsletter and the "Frannie Flossisaurus" and "Mr. Gross Mouth" loaner teaching kits
- Oral health education for participants in the Women, Infants, and Children Supplemental Food Program (WIC)
- Programs adapted for special needs children
- Oral health education for public health and social service professionals
- Parent/guardian information including the importance of regular dental check-ups and dental sealants

Programs cover a variety of topics including: oral health and hygiene instruction, importance of regular dental check-ups, healthy food choices, oral effects of tobacco/vape use, oral cancer, prevention of oral injury, oral piercing, importance of mouthguards, periodontal disease and the systemic connection between oral and general health.
