THE FAMILY CENTERED HIV CARE NETWORK

The primary purpose of the Family-Centered Care Network is to provide comprehensive, culturally sensitive, coordinated care for women, children, youth and families with HIV infection The Network offers HIV specialty care, medical management, access to clinical drug trials, referral and follow-up services, outreach, counseling and testing, and family case management.

PROGRESS AND GROWTH OF THE NETWORK

Since 1988, the Network has focused its efforts on developing family centered care facilities designed to provide or arrange for comprehensive treatment for women, children, youth and families infected with or affected by HIV disease. The centers have become highly skilled in providing psycho-social services, and medical and nursing care to families dealing with HIV as a chronic illness. Approximately 2,000 families are receiving services at seven sites throughout the State of New Jersey.

SERVICES AVAILABLE AT NETWORK CENTERS

- * HIV/AIDS specialty care
- * General medical care and physical examinations
- * Developmental assessments
- * Laboratory tests including free rapid testing for HIV
- * Mental health care, and counseling and psychological support
- * Participation in adult and pediatric clinical trials
- * Coordination of hospital and home care for HIV-positive clients
- * Family referrals to appropriate medical and community-based care
- * Prenatal, obstetric and gynecology care
- * Dental care, eye care and nutrition counseling
- * Adolescent age-appropriate programs
- * Case management and social support services
