MEETING

The Action Team members introduced themselves by including their names and organizations in the chat.

Camilla reviewed and responded to the comments and questions submitted in the chat from the previous meeting about the objectives and strategies, and then guided Action Team members through a review of each objective, strategy, and related resources for the Access to Quality Care priority areas:

1. Strengthen the availability and equity of primary care services statewide,
2. Eliminate cost-associated barriers to care,
3. Improve quality and safety in healthcare settings, and
4. Collect and analyze data across key demographics that will address health disparities.

There was a question of whether programs proposed under NJ's Rural Health Transformation Program application (i.e. mobile health clinics, expansion of healthcare extender roles including community health workers, doulas, etc.) could help address access to primary care challenges. If funded, NJ's Rural Health Transformation Program would direct funding to support workforce development; primary care, behavioral health, and emergency medical services; telehealth, mobile health, and remote patient monitoring; preventive health; and investment in data integration to improve chronic disease treatment. It was noted that telemedicine not only addresses location-specific barriers to care but also helps people with disabilities. Deaf and hard of hearing individuals who want providers who are sign-fluent may use telemedicine instead of traveling long distances. The New Jersey Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing funds mobile audiology services in 14 counties for older adults who cannot travel or are in underserved areas.
