

**Community Conversations: Pandemic Perspectives, NJ's COVID-19 Storytelling Project** is a collaboration between NJ YMCA State Alliance and NJ Department of Health.




"When my brother was ill with COVID, I took him to the hospital, and **because he does not have health insurance**, although we arrived first, he was the last to be called. My brother was coughing loudly, and another man arrived behind him like 15 minutes later [...] they asked him if he had health insurance and he said yes, so he was allowed to pass first, and my brother was left until the end. [...] You see those cases and one thinks, **help is definitely not the same for everyone**, especially for those who don't have health insurance." (Participant 075)





