Hospice Licensing Standards

Readoption with Technical Changes: N.J.A.C. 8:42C

Authority: N.J.S.A. 26:2H-1 et seq., particularly, 26:2H-5.

Take notice that, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, the Acting Commissioner (Acting Commissioner) of the Department of Health (Department) hereby readopts N.J.A.C. 8:42C, Hospice Licensing Standards. N.J.A.C. 42C, Hospice Licensing Standards, establishes uniform standards for the licensure and operation of outpatient and inpatient hospices in New Jersey.

Subchapter 1, General Provisions, provides the scope and purpose of the chapter, which is to ensure that hospices provide quality services.

Subchapter 2, Licensure and Licensure Procedures, establishes licensure procedures that govern applications for filing a license; plan reviews of newly constructed, renovated, and expanded facilities; facility surveys; transfers of ownership;

license surrenders; waiver applications; enforcement actions against a licensee; and appeal rights.

Subchapter 3, General Requirements, provides operation standards for hospices.

Subchapter 4, Administration, establishes the administrative responsibilities in a hospice.

Subchapter 5, Patient Rights, establishes requirements for the development and implementation of policies and procedures addressing patient rights.

Subchapter 6, Patient Care Services, establishes minimum standards for patient care policies and services.

Subchapter 7, Nursing Services, establishes requirements for the provision of nursing services.

Subchapter 8, Pharmacy Services, addresses requirements for pharmaceutical services.

Subchapter 9, Medical/Health Records, establishes the requirements for medical/health records of individuals receiving services at a hospice.

Subchapter 10, Infection Prevention and Control, establishes infection prevention and control standards for hospices.

Subchapter 11, Inpatient Hospice Care Unit, establishes standards for the physical plant and environment of inpatient hospice facilities. Specifically, the rules address the square footage requirements of areas where services are provided, laundry and dietary services.

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c, the rules at N.J.A.C. 42C, Hospice Licensing Standards, were scheduled to expire April 20, 2024. The Acting

Commissioner has reviewed N.J.A.C. 8:42C and determined, subject to the technical changes described below, that the chapter continues to be necessary, adequate, reasonable, efficient, understandable, and responsive to the purposes for which it was originally promulgated and should be readopted. Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), N.J.A.C. 8:42C is readopted and shall continue in effect for an additional seven years.

The Department is making technical changes throughout the chapter. The change at N.J.A.C. 8:42C-2.5(h) would remove the date for an exemption for licensure because the exemption no longer applies (as the date has passed). Similarly, the change at N.J.A.C. 8:42C-11.1(c) would remove a provision that is no longer relevant as the dates have passed. Additional technical changes throughout the chapter would update references to publications incorporated by reference and add and/or correct website addresses.
