C. CHARACTERISTICS OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

C1 - Mean math, reading and writing SAT scores

In fall 2009, Ramapo College of New Jersey enrolled 934 first-time, full-time freshmen (FTFTF). Of these, 80% (n=748) were Regular Admits, 9% (n=84) were EOF students, and 11% (n=105) were special Admits (n=75) were Special Admits. Since fall 2005 the total number of FTFTF enrolled at the College has increased 25%.

Undergraduate enrollment by sex in fall 2009 was approximately 58% female and 42% male. Since fall 2005 enrollment of male students has increased at a greater rate than female students; 15.6 percent point change and 6.9 percentage point change respectively.
