On July 1, 2019, Rowan College at Gloucester County and Cumberland County College merged to create South Jersey's first regional college. Rowan College of South Jersey — a new regional college, academically designed to transform higher education in New Jersey. Together these two campuses offer more than 120 unique degrees and certificates, combining 100 years of experience to provide a variety of degree selections, cost-saving initiatives and scholarship and internship opportunities, at one of the lowest tuition rates in the state. 1. Institutional Accreditation

Rowan College of South Jersey is licensed by the State of New Jersey. It is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Higher Education. Initially accredited in 1973, accreditation was reaffirmed in 1977, 1987, 1998, 2008, and 2018. Middle States approved the merger between Rowan College of Gloucester County and Cumberland County College on June 28, 2019. The next accreditation review is scheduled for 2022.
