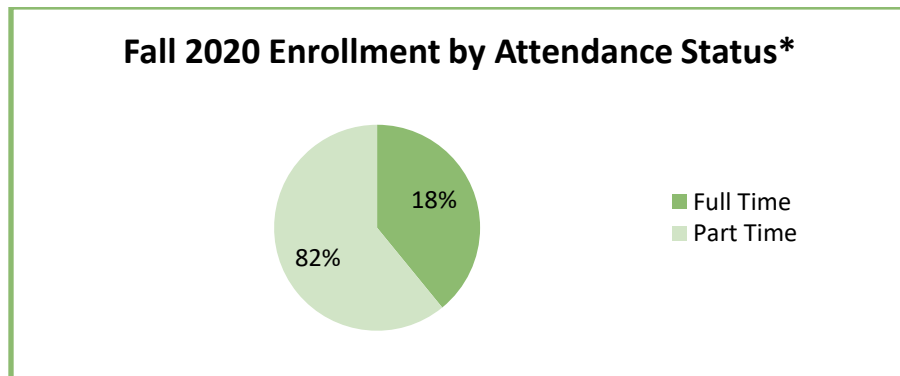

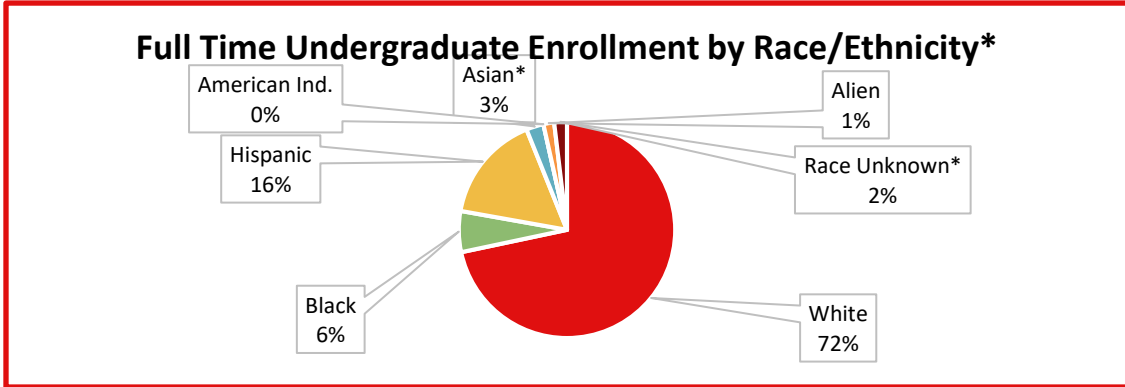

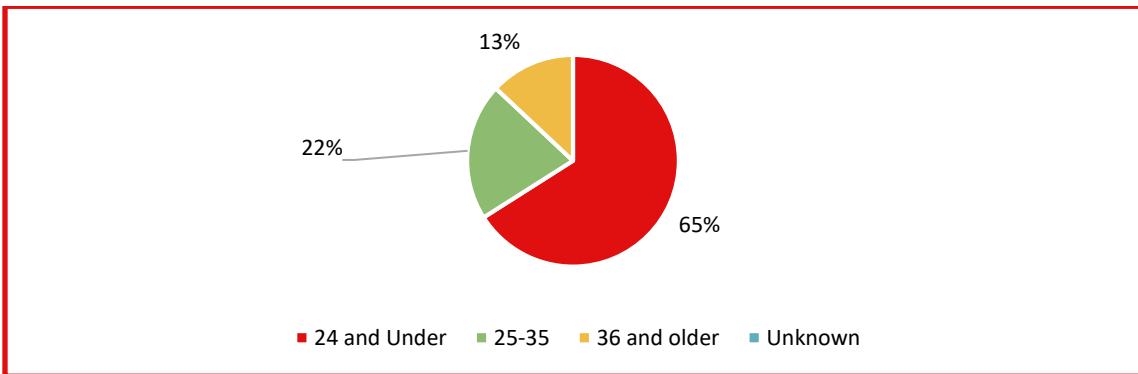

Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity:



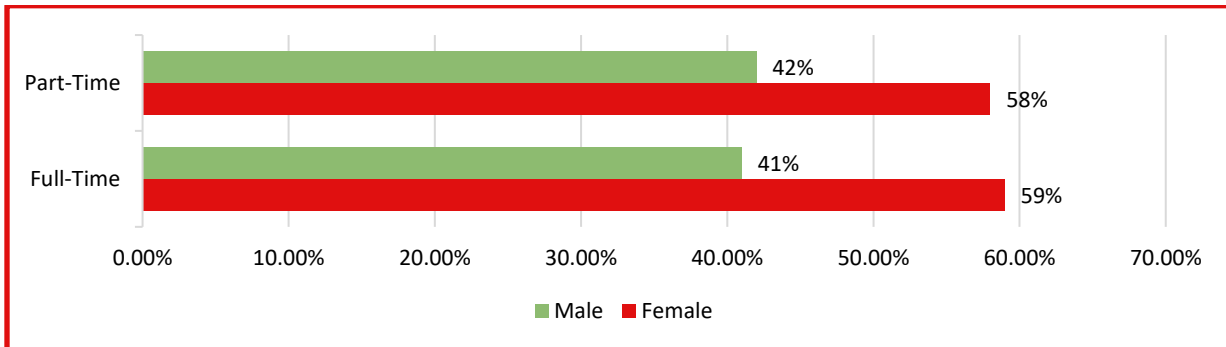

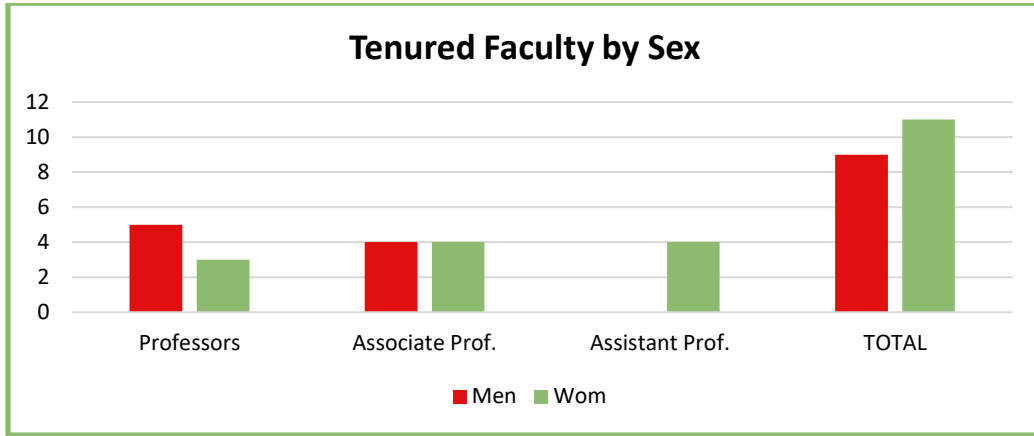

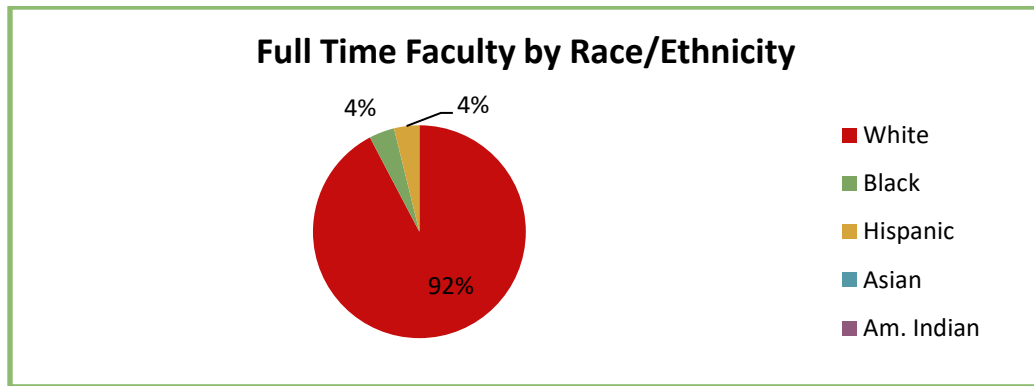

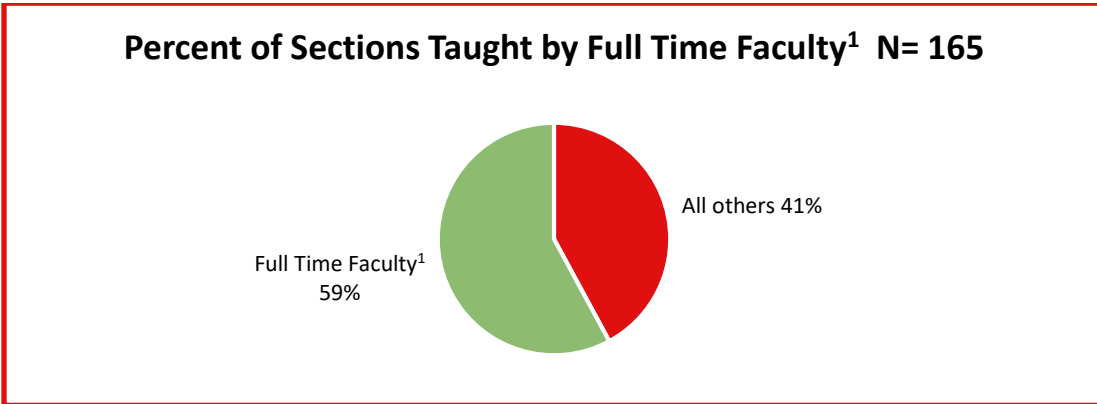
