PREFACE

This past year represents a challenging – yet hopeful – time in the history of Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ); a period during which the institution evolved to meet the shifting needs of its students, faculty and staff as the dark cloud of COVID-19 and its restrictions started to wane.

RCSJ began the fiscal year centerstage in the national conversation on college affordability. On August 5, 2021, U.S. Secretary of Education, Miguel Cardona, was welcomed to the Gloucester campus for a roundtable discussion with local leaders and dignitaries. Secretary Cardona toured RCSJ's Nursing & Health Professions division before he met with students to hear their first-person accounts outlining how RCSJ helped to put a college education within reach.

September marked the beginning of the Fall 2021 semester and the celebrated return of in-classroom learning. The reinstatement of on-campus classes, along with the continuation of hybrid, online and live online course delivery methods, guaranteed a range of academic delivery options to suit individualized student needs and preferences.

On October 7, 2021, RCSJ, Rowan University and the Rowan School of Osteopathic Medicine expanded their partnership with a groundbreaking for a Cumberland campus Rowan Medicine Center, while the Rowan Medicine Center on RCSJ's Gloucester campus conducted outreach on available patient care services. Later that month, on October 18, the College held a ribbon-cutting for the Mechatronics Innovation Learning Lab, which provides laboratory and classroom space for both RCSJ and Rowan University Engineering Technology majors.

RCSJ continued to deepen its long-standing commitment to educating and supporting student-veterans, garnering local and national attention. On November 11, 2021, the College received the "We Value Our Veterans" award from Governor Murphy, and, in early 2022, RCSJ ranked #3 within its category on a national list of the top Military Friendly® Schools.

During the Spring 2022 semester the College focused on expanding opportunities through strategic partnerships. On April 22, RCSJ forged a historic premier partnership in education, employment, and patient care with Inspira Health. This latest "EDs & MEDs" collaboration provides priority clinical experience to support RCSJ students and funding for the development of future educational pathways to real-life jobs.

RCSJ has continued to operate in accordance with its Strategic Plan for 2020-2023, which addresses public health, socioeconomic and educational modifications necessary to secure a strong and stable vision for the future. By integrating learning disciplines, enhancing existing programs to align with shifting workforce needs and developing new programs and services to meet the academic and career goals of students, the College continues its long-standing, student-cultured philosophy.

I am pleased to submit Rowan College of South Jersey's Institutional Profile report for the fiscal year from July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022. All required information is included and, to the extent possible, is accurate and complete.

1. Institutional Accreditation

Rowan College of South Jersey is licensed by the State of New Jersey. It is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Higher Education. Initially accredited in 1973, accreditation was reaffirmed in 1977, 1987, 1998, 2008, and 2018. Middle States approved the merger between Rowan College of Gloucester County and Cumberland County College on June 28, 2019. The next accreditation self-study review is scheduled for 2025-2026.
