PREFACE

This past year's theme in higher education was adaptability and Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ) rose to the occasion. As colleges and universities across the country reacted to what's next in higher education, RCSJ continued its proactive stance of putting students first in decision making and partnerships at the college to enhance educational offerings, behavioral health support, and industry-training offerings. RCSJ is committed to meeting the needs of its students and community.

In summer 2022, two Summer Connect events were held to engage new students and help them navigate campus while learning about student success resources. New Student Orientations provided vital technology training and updates to keep students informed and connected. Approximately 1,000 students were welcomed on both campuses at our Fall Welcome Events. Students received resource information about campus life, leadership opportunities, and critical campus policies and protocols to navigate a successful year.

On Nov. 8, 2022, RCSJ lauded the accomplishments of first-generation students at its National First-Generation College Celebration. This celebration was created to mark the anniversary of the signing of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965. HEA ushered in programs, particularly the Federal TRIO programs, necessary for postsecondary access, retention, and completion for low-income, potential first-generation college graduates. In 2022, RCSJ-Cumberland had 1,300 first generation students enrolled.

RCSJ was proud to announce a new Premier Partnership with Acenda Integrated Health, Inc. in February 2023. This compelling collaboration will reinforce RCSJ and Acenda's outstanding commitment to educating, retaining, and filling needed behavioral health and social justice positions in our community. The re-branded Acenda Behavioral Sciences Center on the Gloucester campus will cultivate a college culture that prioritizes wellness.

Just as RCSJ and Inspira Health celebrated the one-year anniversary of their premier partnership, they excitedly cut the ribbon on May 1, 2023, for the newly completed Inspira Health Sciences Center. The two-story, 27,000 sq. ft. Center will be home to the new Respiratory Therapy program (RTP), RCSJ's current Exercise Science program, and the future Medical Technician and Surgical Technician program. The RTP is the first program to emerge from research and development of the Inspira premier partnership.

Spring 2023 also marked the signing of RCSJ's third premier partnership with Rastelli Foods Group. This new Premier Partnership was designed to provide global expertise for industry-backed entrepreneurship and food science programs to educate tomorrow's entrepreneurial, culinary, and agricultural innovators. It will also provide funding for the research and development of future programs – beginning with Data Analytics, Food Process Technology, and Logistics & Supply Chain Management programs.

RCSJ has continued to operate in accordance with its Strategic Plan for 2020-2023, which addresses public health, socioeconomic and educational modifications necessary to secure a strong and stable vision for the future. By integrating learning disciplines, enhancing existing programs to align with

shifting workforce needs and developing new programs and services to meet the academic and career goals of students, the College continues its long-standing, student-cultured philosophy.

I am pleased to submit Rowan College of South Jersey's Institutional Profile report for the fiscal year from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023. All required information is included and, to the extent possible, is accurate and complete.

Initially accredited in 1973, accreditation was reaffirmed in 1977, 1987, 1998, 2008, and 2018.
