#### **PREFACE**

Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ) is a comprehensive, student-centered community college dedicated to providing accessible and affordable education to the residents of southern New Jersey. With campuses in Gloucester and Cumberland counties, RCSJ serves as a dynamic hub for academic excellence, workforce development, and community engagement. Through innovative partnerships, including its unique collaboration with flagship partner Rowan University, the College offers seamless pathways from associate to bachelor's degrees and beyond, alongside career-focused programs that prepare students to meet the demands of today's evolving workforce.

Shortly after welcoming students to campus through Summer Connect, New Student Orientation, and Fall Welcome events, RCSJ got to work celebrating continued growth for student success.

On September 25, 2024, RCSJ and Inspira Health hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony on the College's Gloucester campus for the newly expanded Inspira Nursing and Health Professions Center. The two-story, 15,000 sq. ft. building addition, paid for in large part thanks to the Securing Our Children's Future Bond Act and a matching grant from the County of Gloucester, provides eight additional lab spaces and will increase capacity in the College's healthcare certificate programs.

In October 2024, RCSJ in collaboration with the RCSJ Foundation (RCSJF), along with the Inspira Health Foundation, earmarked \$20,000 and \$10,000, respectively, to the RCSJ Center for Wellness Pantries to combat food insecurity. In early November 2024, RCSJ was awarded a Hunger-Free Campus Act Grant in the amount of \$56,250 for fiscal year 2025 from the New Jersey Office of the Secretary of Higher Education to enhance the mission to combat food insecurity at RCSJ.

Every November, RCSJ's Military Services Department recognizes Veterans Day by highlighting students and staff members who have served. John Ryder, the Director of Student Affairs and Military Services at RCSJ, was recognized at this event. Ryder served in the U.S. Coast Guard, the Gulf War, and is a former Petty Officer 3rd Class (E-4). Ryder earned the prestigious 2024 Veteran Champion of the Year in Higher Education Award. His team earned RCSJ the designation of a 2024-2025 Military Friendly School and a Military Spouse Friendly School.

Also in November, RCSJ, RCSJF, the OceanFirst Foundation, and RCSJ's President Emeritus, Dr. Fred Keating announced plans for the opening of the Keating Family Presidential Institute for First-Generation Students. The Institute will be dedicated to the success of first-generation college students and provide support through scholarships, mentorship, and networking opportunities. The cornerstone of the Institute will be the Kappa Epsilon Chapter of Alpha Alpha Alpha (Tri-Alpha), dedicated to supporting and celebrating the achievements of first-generation students. Tri-Alpha has already inducted 44 student members and 55 faculty and staff members.

In collaboration with Vineland Public Schools (VPS), RCSJ-Cumberland celebrated the grand opening of the Together Café in February 2025. The Together Café provides opportunities for students with disabilities to gain real world experiences. RCSJ's Adult Center for Transition (ACT) students work as interns at the café and partnered with VPS's Reaching Independence through Structured Experiences (R.I.S.E.) program to help expand the café's workforce.

On February 24, RCSJ leadership met with representatives from Woodstown-Pilesgrove Regional School District (WPRSD) to sign the RCSJ Collegiate High School Partnership agreement. WPRSD joined over 30 schools in the region that have partnered with RCSJ's Collegiate High School Program. This innovative partnership provides an affordable, practical way to earn college credits and prepare high school students for the rigors of excelling in a collegiate environment – all before high school graduation. Later that spring, RCSJ, Gloucester County, and Clayton School District leadership gathered to recognize 20 Clayton high school first-year students who were accepted into the same program. In addition, GCIT, already a RCSJ Collegiate High School participant, now bears the distinction of Rowan College Preparatory School. Rowan College Prep is officially recognized by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education as a RCSJ teaching location. This allows GCIT students to take more RCSJ credits on site, up to a full associate degree and/or follow an academic pathway to a bachelor's degree or higher, with Flagship Partner, Rowan University.

During March 2025, RCSJ was chosen as the Lead Institution for the Center of Workforce Innovation for Manufacturing and Supply Chain Logistics as part of the New Jersey Pathways to Career Opportunities Initiative. As the Lead Institution, RCSJ served as the ambassador for the Center of Workforce Innovation, providing strategic leadership and elevating its influence. RCSJ was also a partnering college for Renewable Energy. The initiative aligns education and training with the evolving needs of employers, ensuring the development of a highly skilled workforce.

In April 2025, RCSJ hosted a College Hunger Forum, in collaboration with the Community Foodbank of New Jersey, the Food Bank of South Jersey, the Hunger Free New Jersey program, and the New Jersey Council of Community Colleges. The forum brought together students and leaders from across the state to discuss the landscape of campus food insecurity and how colleges can collaborate with legislators and community impact groups. RCSJ led this necessary conversation by highlighting RCSJ student speakers who have utilized RCSJ's Food Pantries.

Also in April, RCSJ with premier partner Rastelli Foods Group, and the Gloucester County Board of Commissioners, celebrated the opening of the new Rastelli Entrepreneurship Center located within the Rastelli Business and Corporate Center, on RCSJ's Gloucester campus. This entrepreneurial hub is designed to empower students with the skills, tools, and experiences they need to succeed. Students will have access to a co-working space, a dedicated meeting room for business planning, and a packaging demonstration area to support product development.

In early April 2025, after 15 years of service, Dr. Fred Keating stepped down as president of RCSJ effective June 30, 2025. He was nominated and approved by resolution for President Emeritus by the RCSJ Board of Trustees.

On May 6, 2025, the RCSJ Board of Trustees appointed Brenden Rickards, Ph.D. as interim president. Officially, he assumed the role on July 1, 2025. Rickards has been an employee at the College for the past 17 years beginning as a professor in Biology, to Dean of the STEM Division, to Vice President of Academic Services, and finally Vice President and Provost of Academic Services. Rickards looks forward to enhancing educational opportunities available to residents and supporting the ever-changing needs of the communities served.

The Board of Trustees has approved an extension of the Strategic Plan through the 2025-2026 academic year. The College will utilize the results of the Middle States Commission on Higher

Education self-study to inform a new Strategic Plan to continue our long-standing, student-centered philosophy.

I am pleased to submit Rowan College of South Jersey's Institutional Profile report for the fiscal year from July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025. All required information is included and, to the extent possible, is accurate and complete.

#### 1. Institutional Accreditation

Rowan College of South Jersey is licensed by the State of New Jersey. It is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Higher Education. Initially accredited in 1973, accreditation was reaffirmed in 1977, 1987, 1998, 2008, and 2018. Middle States approved the merger between Rowan College of Gloucester County and Cumberland County College on June 28, 2019. The next accreditation self-study review is scheduled for 2025-2026.
