The Upward Bound Math Science Program at Ramapo College of New Jersey seeks a Residential Assistant Intern. Teen Social and Emotional Learning Internship, In-person, 1 open position

Overview of Position

The Upward Bound Math Science Program at Ramapo College of New Jersey seeks a Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Intern. Under the supervision of the Residential Director and the Director of the Upward Bound Math Science (UBMS) Program, the SEL Intern will support the UBMS participants, who are first generation, low-income high school students, by developing programming that addresses participant social and emotional health with the goal of meeting their academic and career development needs while they participate in this college preparatory program.

The intern will learn to assess participant social/emotional and academic needs and implement a multi-tiered system of support, including: 1) core classroom/large group intervention, 2) targeted small group intervention, and 3) intensive individual intervention to assess participant social and emotional needs and to provide coping skills in the management of emotional awareness and emotional regulation. A Bachelor's degree in social work or related field and enrollment in a Master's in Social Work Program for the Fall 2024, as well as strong interpersonal skills are required.

Responsibilities/Duties/Projects

Teen Social and Emotional Learning Internship duties can include the following:

Time Commitment:

- 12.5 hours per week for 4 weeks, June 3- June 28 in preparation for the Summer Program
- 25 hours per week during the 6-week residential program (June 30 August 9)

Assessment of Participant Needs:

- Assess UBMS participant Social and Emotional needs by performing brief screenings using the ACEs-Q, the Connor-Davidson Resilience Scale (CD-RISC-10), the emotional awareness questionnaire, and the emotional regulation questionnaire, reviewing assigned journal entries, performing group/individual discussions, and reviewing the summer behavior log
- Assess UBMS participant academic needs by reviewing school report cards, summer program progress reports, Accuplacer test scores, and SAT practice scores

Multi-Tiered System of Support:

• Develop and implement classroom/large group intervention: brain breaks to build community and relationships and activities for social emotional learning

- Develop and implement targeted small group intervention: RULER activities
- Develop and implement intensive individual intervention (caseload of 5-6): case management, supportive counseling to those in need of more 1-on-1 attention

Record Keeping:

- Maintain detailed records of assessments for each participant
- Maintain detailed notes of small and large group intervention strategies and process recordings of individual sessions.

Environmental Educator, In-person, 2 open positions

Overview of Position

This is a learning opportunity for students who are interested in environmental education. The NJSEA Meadowlands Environment Center (MEC), operated by Ramapo College of New Jersey educators, provides environmental education opportunities to schoolchildren in Grades K-12 through MEC programs. The MEC provides informal STEM education experiences to 15,000 -20,000 students each year. Our programs encourage the use of the environment as a classroom, increase awareness of the resources of the Meadowlands, and help communities recognize critical environmental issues affecting communities such as health, energy use and global climate change. Through inquiry learning and cross-curricular activities we offer hands on educational programs for grades K-12. We provide "life-long" learning programs for young children, families, adults, older adults, and members of the community living with disabilities. Programs include instruction during the day and community engagement through family science nights and scout programs. Students are enrolled in public, private, charter, and homeschool programs. These children are: general education students; special education students from inclusion and self-contained programs; Title 1, low-income, high-risk students; English Language Learners; on the Autism Spectrum; Gifted students including those twice exceptional. Our summer programs include STEM enrichment programs for school districts and community recreation programs as well as MEC summer day-camps and professional development workshops for teachers.

Under the direction of the Education Coordinator at the Meadowlands Environment Center; the Environmental Educator intern will assist in the implementation of educational programs for visiting groups. They will also perform routine educational support and animal care tasks. The staff at the MEC will mentor the interns; we expect that after they have mastered some content, the interns will be able and comfortable to assume some opportunities to instruct the classes under the guidance of the staff.
