

EMPLOYMENT, DEVELOPMENT, GUIDANCE, AND ENGAGEMENT

In partnership with the Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired, EDGE (Employment, Development, Guidance and Engagement) supports blind, deaf-blind and vision impaired high school and college students transition into independent living, self-advocacy and career development.

With former EDGE enrollees now on staff and in mentor roles, we are able to bring a unique, first-hand perspectives that will give enrollees an "edge" in moving towards independence and career development.

This year-round program consists of two parts: EDGE 1.0 and EDGE 2.0. Both have a double layer of support, via blind and vision impaired staffers and mentors, who will collaborate with enrollees to plan for success and assist in reaching it.

EDCE 1 (MICH SCHOOL PROGRAM)

Involves Saturday Workshop Series Events & Applied Learning Activity Events teaching skills necessary for transitioning from parent supervision to assumption of adult responsibilities.

Topics covered include but are not limited to:

- Self-discovery

EDGE 2 (GOLLEGE PROGRAM)

Involves online classes and boots-on-theground Career-Focused College Advisors to assist undergrads to assimilate into college life, both on and off campus, in a careerfocused way.

Topics covered include but are not limited to:

- Getting the most out of the Disability Services Office
- Establishing faculty relationships that enhance learning and result in letters of recommendation
- Utilizing information and assistive technology
- O Developing interpersonal relationships on and off campus
- Creating opportunities for competitive employment, stipend work, or work exploration experiences related to a major field of study
