Day and Residential Providers



A reminder for ALL providers:

- OSubmit claims for services rendered on or before June 30, 2020 by that date, if at all possible.
- This allows the State to claim additional federal match during the emergency period.

Re-Opening Workgroup



- While there still is no timeframe for the reopening of day programs, the Division has organized a Re-Opening Workgroup.
- The group is comprised of family members, a self-advocate, day service providers, The Boggs Center and the NJ Council on Developmental Disabilities.
- The group has been meeting diligently.



Re-Opening Workgroup



- The group has reviewed information from various areas including, but not limited to:
 - The Centers of Disease Control and Prevention;
 - Guidance from other New Jersey State agencies (Department of Health, Department of Children and Families, etc.);
 - Guidance from other states related to their reopening strategies.





Re-Opening Workgroup



Some of the priority areas:

- Guidance on an Individual Assessment to assist families and providers in planning for an individual's return.
- o Guidance that will provide recommendations for items to address in order to reopen safely.
- o Guidance on a Site Assessment for providers to ensure their facilities are set up appropriately.





Visitation – Group Homes



- On Thursday, June 18, the Division released Residential Visitation Guidance and an updated Residential Screening Policy.
- This is the first step toward visits with families and friends. Updates will occur as more information is learned about COVID-19 as the state re-opens.





Visitation – Group Homes



- Required aspects of the visits:
 - Screening for signs and symptoms.
 - Social Distancing.
 - ▼ It is recognized that some residents may have difficulty. Therefore, any contact should be brief.
 - Wearing Personal Protective Equipment.
 - ➤ Residents are encouraged to wear masks, but it is understood that some may not tolerate a mask or it may not be medically advisable for them to wear.
 - × Visitors must wear PPE as directed.

Visitation – Developmental Centers



- On June 19, the Department of Health released Executive Directive 20-017 – Standards and Protocols for Visitors and Facility Staff.

Visitation – Developmental Centers



- All five of the Division's Developmental Centers are following this guidance.
- Visits resumed June 21, Fathers Day.
- Similar to the guidance for group homes, visits are to be outdoors, are required to be socially distanced, and participants are to wear appropriate PPE.





PPE Distribution Update



- The Division is pleased to relay that it is providing a second round of PPE to the approximately 1,200 families who utilize SDEs that reside outside of their household.
- Contactless delivery of PPE began last week.
- We would like to thank our partners and state staff who have assisted/are assisting in deliveries.





PPE Distribution Update



- One box of gloves and one box of masks allocated per household.
- Total amount of PPE to be distributed in this round:
 - Nearly 60,000 pairs of gloves; and
 - Nearly 60,000 masks.





SDE Service Documentation




- **x Reminder:** All self-directed employees (SDEs) are required to maintain service documentation notes for services delivered, including family members hired as SDEs.
- ➤ PPL and the Division will operationalize electronic and paper timesheet service documentation process this summer. Information and webinar training will be announced in July.
- **★** The new fee-for-service Agency with Choice SDE model through Easterseals includes service documentation process.
